Visit Description

C4 will be led and hosted by Áslandsskóli, Kríuás 1, 221 Hafnarfirði, Iceland

The aims of the training are:

- 1. Develop knowledge, understanding and skills of delegates on methods of evaluating quality of education provision, peer observation and self-evaluation.
- 2. To demonstrate Pupil Progress meetings and presentation of what classroom success looks like and actions necessary.
- 3. To introduce some of our projects in an all age school and tell about the programs how we have approached its implementation with particular emphasis on how our new pedagogical approach is improving and supporting social mobility.

Project Description

This project builds on KA2 Culture of Learning (CoL) ending in August 2019. The project has successfully developed greater social inclusion of pupils within our schools of St Joseph's (SJ), Greenway Primary (GP) Wales & Aslandsskoli (AS), Iceland. CoL was designed to help teachers develop a culture of learning supporting pupils to achieve fully & prepared for work/life within a rapidly changing 21st Century landscape.

It used 7 key areas to drive change that reflect ET 2020: **PRIORITIES** - young people will need a more skills based approach for successful living/employment. Our motivation is to share CoL successes with more schools specifically practices/methodologies developed between schools. CoL based on **OECD** Nature of Learning used **RESEARCH** to **INSPIRE PRACTICE** as a catalyst to rethinking what is taught, how it is taught/how learning is assessed, underpinning the more skills & competences based approach to education in 2019. We have created a learning culture in schools based on these principles, research methods/first hand observation to rethink how **LEARNING** is delivered for all learners with greater **EQUITY**. CoL matrix and toolkit supported schools to drill down with staff/pupils to identify priorities to improve provision/culture.
